5 APR 44 On the strafing show to Stendal, his a/c struck a high-tension wire and caught fire. Unable to exit, he put his ship down in a lake to extinguish the fire. Dazed by the impact, he sank with the Mustang.

Eventually, after struggling with his belt and harness, he extricated himself from the cockpit and made his way to shore. POW. (MACR 3609)
