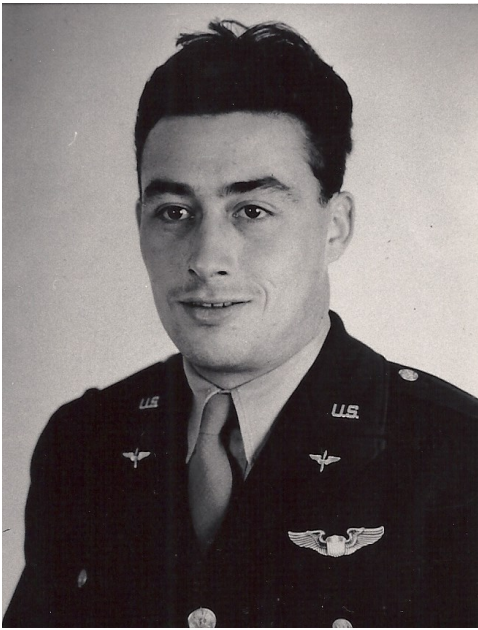


GILLETTE, Willard G.

"G.I."

B: 11 May 1918 Ottawa, KS



"I closed to about 150-175 yards at 12-15° and fired. I looked at my altimeter and showed 2700 feet and airspeed 450 plus. I saw strikes in the rear of his fuselage and tail and he rolled into a vertical dive. I broke off because I saw some kites behind me and there were more 109's in the area."
