*"I closed dead astern and 20°-30° above him. Dropping a little flap to slow down, I opened fire at 450 yards, getting hits at once on the left wing. I corrected a little and got hits over motor, tail and wings, closing fairly fast. The e/a fell off on one wing and I got in a good burst in this position pulling negative G's. His motor either quit or he cut it. I slid up in a turn to get ready for another pass when he bailed out."*
