

4 MAY 43 Aircraft began smoking and losing speed as he approached the Dutch coast. At 2,500', it was seen to roll over on its back and go straight into the Channel, 55 miles east of Clacton. Lutz was seen to bail out of the aircraft, but his wingman was unable to see if his chute opened. Lutz was seen floating motionless on the surface. An ASR Walrus was dispatched but was unable to locate him.
