WEST PALM BEACH, Feb. 22.—Mr. and Mrs. J. S. Moon have received word from his wife in Ottawa, Can., that their son, Lt. Ivan R. Moon, was killed in action on the European front last Nov. 3. The War department message said that the German government had so notified the International Red Cross.

His parents here previously had been notified that the boy had gone on a mission over Holland with his squadron, and that following an engagement, he had not returned.

Lt. Moon was 20 years old and attended local schools. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air force as an instructor in May of 1941. He later went to England as a bomber pilot, and last April was transferred into the United States Army Air force. He was married in Canada.
