
## SOBANSKI, Winslow S. "Mike" "The Pole"

"I fired a few short 1/2-second bursts closing in, and was just going to position myself better on him, as I saw no strikes. Much to my surprise, he jettisoned his canopy and bailed out. I watched his a/c half-roll and crash, and then took a picture of him in the parachute. I claim this ME-109 as destroyed, and a scared Hun."
