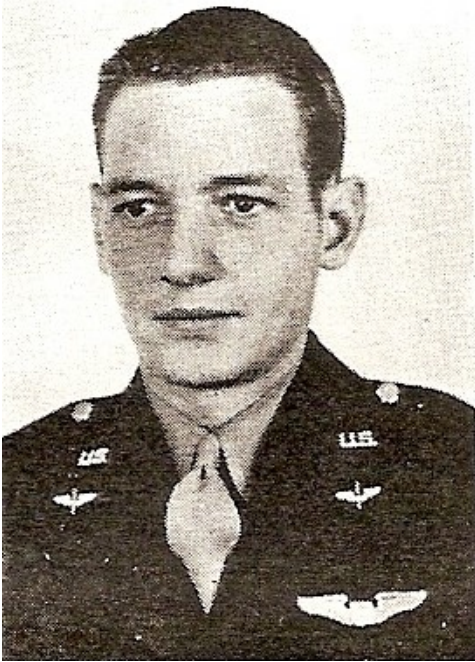


SCARBROUGH, Milton G.

"As we hit the edge of the field I saw two large A/C at which I took a short burst. On the opposite side of the A/D I saw two more A/C sitting in front of a hangar. I fired at one of these A/C which I believe to be a HE-177. I saw strikes on the tail surface, along the fuselage and in the wing roots."

24 APR 44 Squadron attacked a gaggle of 50+ German aircraft. In the ensuing combat he shot down 1 FW-190 before succumbing to a stern attack. Right arm burned by fire and face burned by hot coolant before managing to bail out NE of Worms, Germany.
