# WARD WORTMAN. EAGLE PILOT, LOST

Spokane Golf Champ in Le Bourget Raid July 14.

Second Lieutenant Ward K. Wortman, 26, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. J. Wortman, E306 Nineteenth, is listed as missing in action since July 14 in the European area, according to wire information received by his family.

Lieutenant Wortman, member of a fighter pilot group of the Eighth air force stationed in England, is believed to have last participated in the raid on July 14 over Le Bourget airport in the Paris suburbs and four other German installations. His family received a lettre from him Friday, written

Shortly after Pearl Harbor, Lieutenant Wortman joined the royal Canadian air force and received his training at Tulsa, Okla. He won his pilot officer wings following this training and went into the coyal air force, where he piloted Spitfires. In October of 1942 he transferred to the United States army air corps. Lieutenant Wortman went overseas in May of 1942 with the R. C. A. F. from Canada.

#### Joined Eagle Squadron.

After his transfer into the army air corps, Lieutenant Wortman was placed with a group of American pilots who had also been with the R. A. F. and had formed the Amercan Eagle squadron.

Well known in Spokane and hroughout the Inland Empire for nis golf, Lieutenant Wortman was city golf champion, as well as at Manito, and the Inland Empire golf champion. He attended the University of Washington and Stanford University of Chronicle
