13 JUL 44 While on an escort mission to Munich,
aircraft struck by flak at 26,000' through
10/10 cloud cover. His Mustang began
streaming fuel and glycol, and losing
speed and altitude. When he reached the
top of the cloud cover at 8,000' he rolled
the aircraft on its side and bailed out
safely, landing 3 miles north of
Birkenfeld, Germany. POW (MACR 6711/6719)

Remained in the USAF for 26 years, holding posts in
the ATC and ADC. He also served overseas in France,
Germany and Italy. His last assignment was as
Director of Maintenance, McCord AFB, Washington, DC
