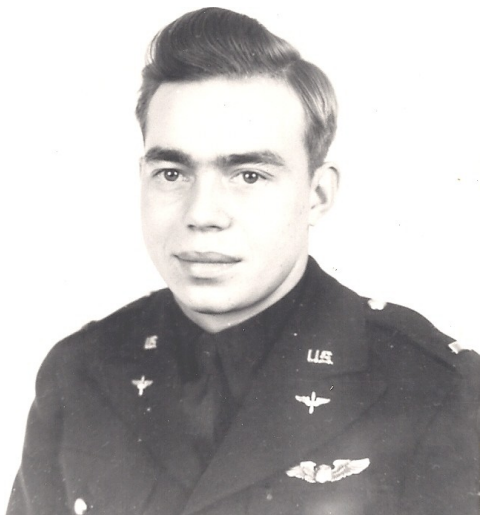


EMERSON, Donald R.

“About my room - I have a very comfortable bed with a thick mattress and sheets, etc. I have a dresser with a large mirror and plenty of drawers...a wall closet with more room than necessary for my clothes. I have a nice writing desk with a wash basin with a mirror above it. The room has steam heat and carpeting on the floor...outside of the fact that we are in combat, to say that we have it nice would be putting it mildly”

21 JUN 44 Participated in Operation FRANTIC II, the Russia Shuttle mission. (RTB 5 JUL)

27 JUL 44 Promoted to Captain

AUG 44 Designated Flight Commander A Flight

15 DEC 44 Designated Flight Commander B Flight

25 DEC 44 Led his section into combat against FW-190's attacking the bomber stream. Afterward, separated from his section, he was caught down on the deck alone by ME-109's. Members of his section heard his transmissions but were unable to locate him. After downing at least one of his attackers, he radioed he was heading home. Struck by flak just as he was crossing friendly lines, he crashed in Elsloo, Holland. KIA.

Buried at the American Military Cemetery in Margraten, Holland. Plot B Row 15 Grave 21.
