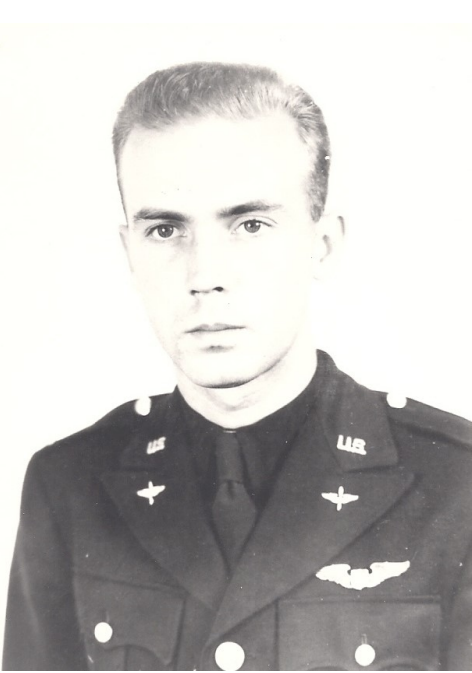


HUSTWIT, Earl F.

"Then I went after another one. I saw strikes on the wings. At 3,000 feet I was doing over 400 MPH when my engine quit cold. I saw this FW-190 smoking from the right wing, flick over on his back and start spinning at this altitude. I don't believe at that altitude and that speed the pilot could recover control of his airplane so I claim this as destroyed."

26 MAR 45 Aircraft developed a coolant leak causing the engine to catch fire near Aachen, Germany. His chute struck the tail just after he left the aircraft. KIA.
