Mother Learns Pilot Is Killed

Mrs. Vieva Wilson White, 5004 Calmont, has received official notification of the death of her son, 2nd Lt. Robert W. White, who was killed Sept. 10 when his plane crashed in England on the return trip from a mission over Germany.

White, a Mustang fighter pilot, had completed more than 400 hours in the air. He entered the RCAF in 1940, and was sent to England in December of the following year. He served with the RAF in Egypt for a year and was returned to Britain in 1942. He transferred to the American Air Forces in 1943.
