

Kinnard Named To Lead Fourth Fighter Group

London, Nov. 23.—(P)—Lt. Col. Claiborne H. Kinnard Jr., 32-year-old fighter pilot from Franklin, Tenn., has assumed command of the Fourth Fighter Group of the U. S. Eighth Air Force, headquarters announced today.

Kinnard, who has destroyed six enemy planes in aerial combat and 15 by strafing, succeeds Col. Don Blakeslee, Fairport Harbor, Ohio, who has been ordered to a new assignment in the U. S.

The Fourth Fighter Group is the Eight's highest scoring Mustang group, with more than 700 Nazi craft destroyed in the air and or the ground.
